
Wallingford-Swarthmore School District

State Funding and Local Taxes

In 2011, Governor Corbett cut \$1 billion from state education funding and dismantled the funding formula, making Pennsylvania one of only 3 states that do not use a formula.

Now, school districts are receiving less state funding.


With the amount of state aid received for the 2013-14 academic year, Wallingford-Swarthmore School District is still more than \$150 thousand away from restoring funds back to 2010-2011 levels

To cope with state budget cuts, the burden of funding schools has fallen on local communities. During the past three years, many school districts have raised property taxes at least once.



Wallingford-Swarthmore is one of ten school districts in Delaware County that have raised property taxes more than 5%.

Student Performance Facts


- Wallingford-Swarthmore School District is one of 5 school districts in Delaware County that graduates more than 95% of its students.
- *In Wallingford-Swarthmore, Black *In 2011-2012, 90% of Wallingfordand economically disadvantaged students score more than 20% lower in math than the average of all students..
 - Swarthmore students performed at or above grade level in reading and math.

What does the future hold for Wallingford-Swarthmore School District?

The Governor's 2014-15 budget proposal calls for \$241 million to restore funding for Pennsylvania's schools, most of which will be available through the newly created *Ready to Learn Block Grant*. If the Governor's proposal is adopted by legislature, next year districts will be \$440 million short in state funds compared to 2010-11 funding levels.

With the Governor's proposed *Ready to Learn Block Grant* for the 2014-15 academic year, the Wallingford-Swarthmore School District will more than reach 2010-2011 funding levels.
