**Governor Wolf’s Proposed Budget is a \$1 Billion Win for Children and Homeowners in Southeastern Pennsylvania**

*Provides New Investments in Schools and Property Tax Relief for Homeowners*

**PHILADELPHIA** (March 3<sup>rd</sup>, 2015) – Governor Tom Wolf’s proposed budget will net Southeastern Pennsylvania with more than a \$1 billion in funding for schools and property tax relief, according to new analysis from Public Citizens for Children and Youth (PCCY).

PCCY finds that the Governor’s budget proposal will invest \$217 million more in state funding for schools in Bucks, Chester, Delaware, Montgomery, and Philadelphia for the 2015-2016 school year. Additionally, the Governor’s property tax relief plan will save homeowners in Philadelphia and the surrounding suburbs \$835 million in fiscal year 2016-2017.
