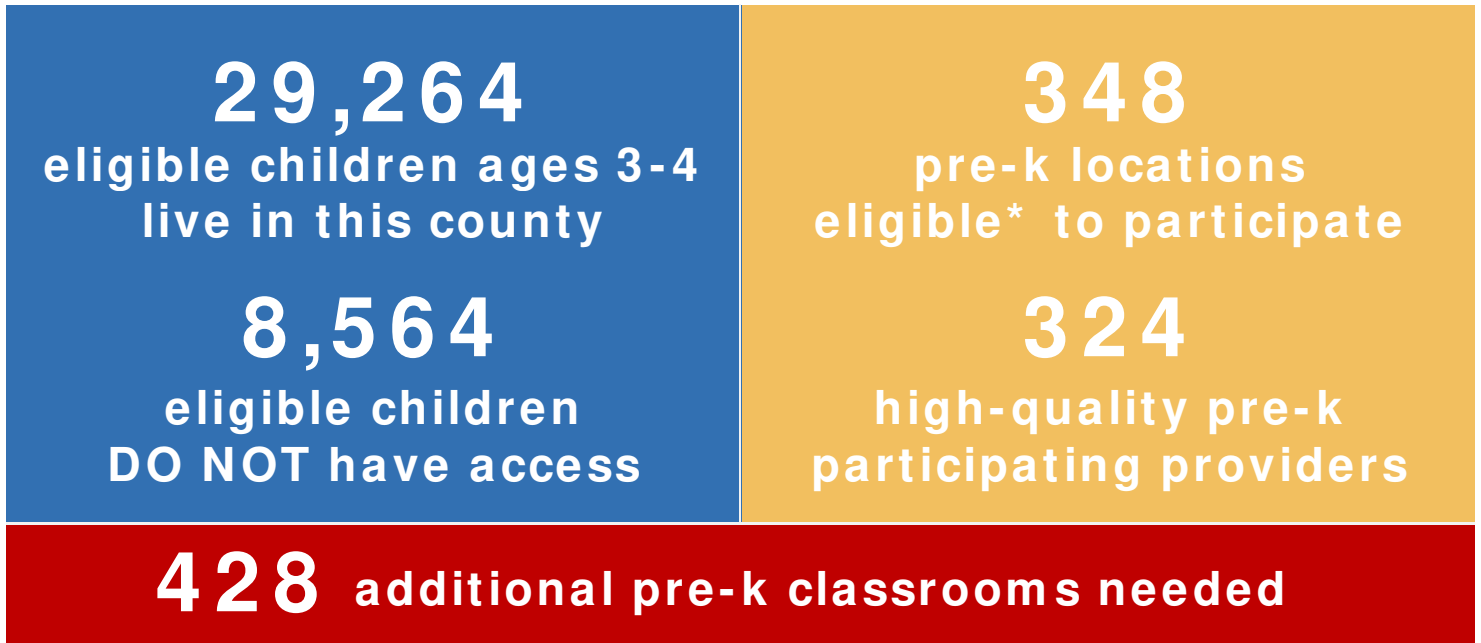


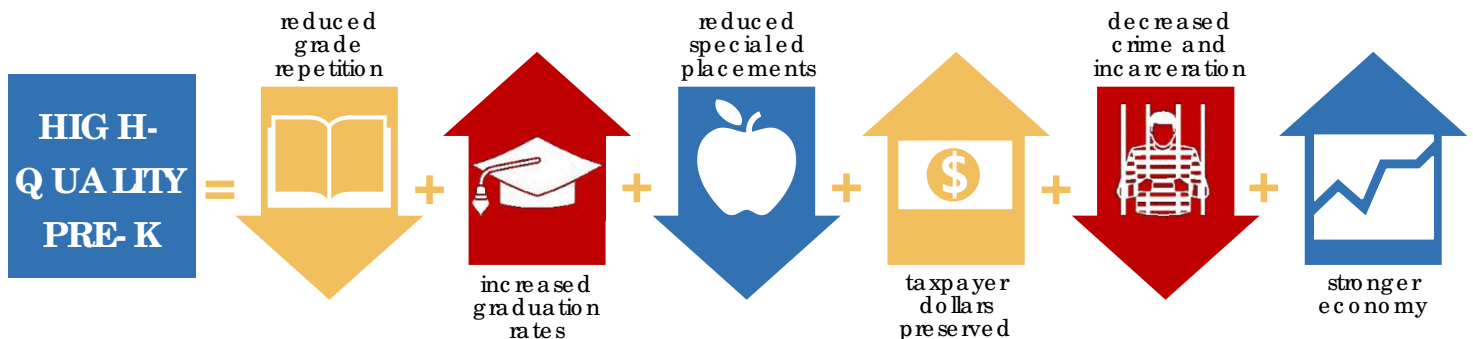
IMPORTANCE OF HIGH-QUALITY, PUBLICLY FUNDED PRE-K Philadelphia County

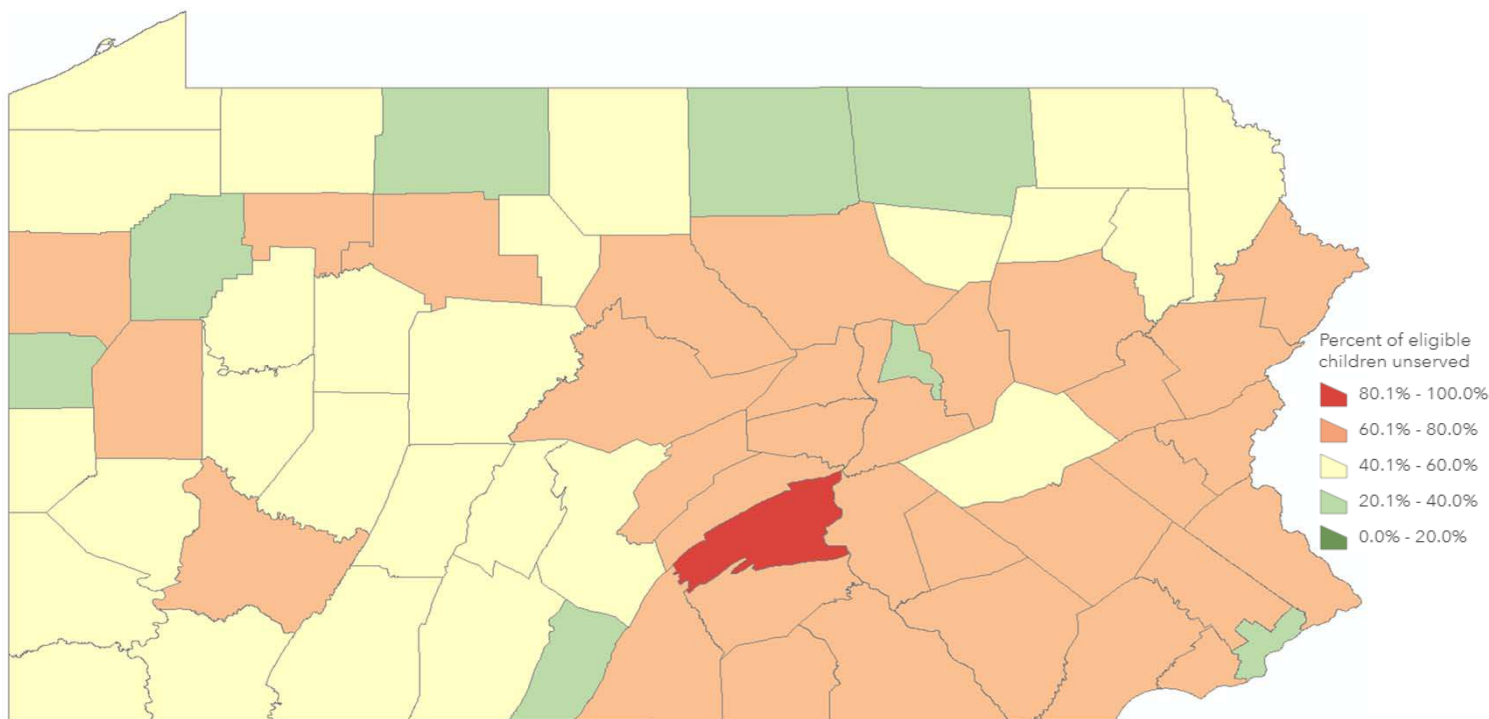
