


Avon Grove School District

Aligning cyber charter tuition with actual costs could save Avon Grove School District over \$77,000

Cyber charter costs are growing rapidly.

Before the pandemic, 830 students living in the Avon Grove School District were enrolled in cyber charters. Last year cyber enrollment surged by 59% statewide, which translates to a projected 1320 District students in cyber charter schools.



The current system of setting charter

school tuition rates is broken. Avon Grove currently pays cybers \$26,288 for every special education student and \$11,722 for other students. That is significantly more than the actual costs of providing an online education and is a boon to cyber charter operators.

HB 272 and SB 27 will save local taxpayers \$77,654 by bringing charter school tuition more in line with actual costs. The bill standardizes cyber charter tuition at \$9,500 and requires charter schools to use the same criteria as every other public school to calculate special education tuition.
