

## Cyber charter costs up an estimated \$89,000 in Springfield Township School District intensifying pressure on property taxes

**Cyber charter costs are growing rapidly.** Before the pandemic, 16 students living in the Springfield Township School District were enrolled in cyber charters. Last year cyber enrollment surged by 59% statewide, which translates to a projected 25 District students in cyber charter schools.



Because of sharply higher cyber enrollment,

cyber tuition costs in Springfield Township jumped by an estimated \$89,000 since 2020, a shocking 64% increase paid for by taxpayers in the district.

**The current system of setting charter school tuition rates is broken.** Springfield Township currently pays cybers \$39,121 for every special education student and \$16,780 for other students. That is significantly more than the actual costs of providing an online education and is a boon to cyber charter operators.

HB 272 and SB 27 will save local taxpayers \$166,159 by bringing charter school tuition more in line with actual costs. The bill standardizes cyber charter tuition at \$9,500 and requires charter schools to use the same criteria as every other public school to calculate special education tuition.
