Message From the Chairman

Far too many Black, Hispanic, and poor children in our communities grow up in early learning deserts, attend under-resourced schools, lack after school or summer enrichment options, suffer from poor quality health care, and often are harmed by the very systems intended to protect or rehabilitate them.

Children First is a one-of-a-kind organization that gives us each a concrete way to make the lives of kids better.

Your investment in Children First is paying dividends. This year, we looked at the return on your giving – or the ROI. Every dollar and volunteer hour you contributed to Children First generated a \$131 return for kids evidenced by more access to great early learning options, better performing public schools, innovative mental health services for youth coping with trauma, and new protections for the most vulnerable children in our region.

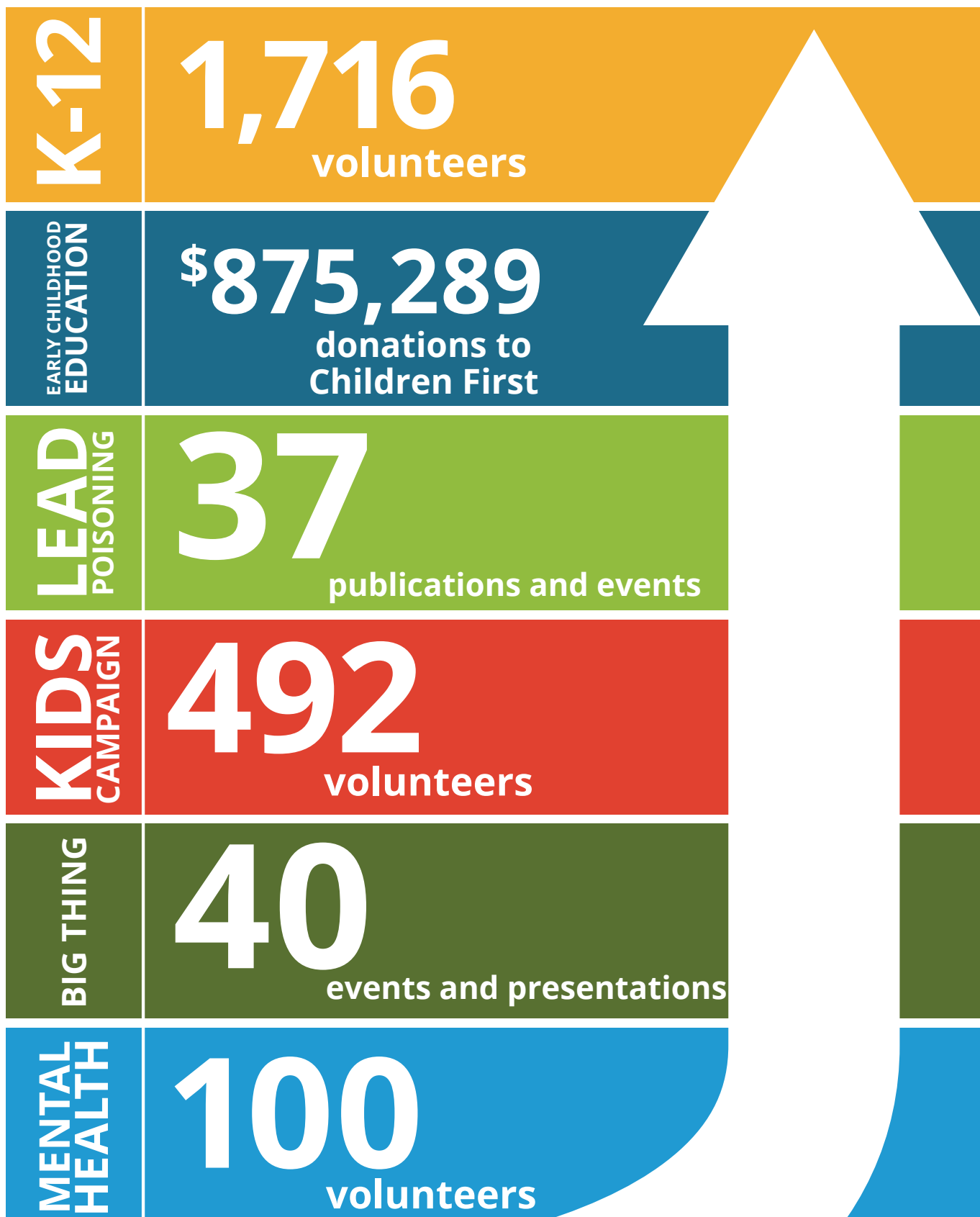

Opportunity, Unleashing
Next Generation
Advocates**

The historical, legal victory that confirmed that Pennsylvania's school funding system is unconstitutional fueled our momentum to persuade state lawmakers to invest in the public schools that educate 1.7 million students.



Instead of taking the sober court decision to heart, politicians attempted to thwart progress toward enacting a constitutional remedy by shifting the debate to old tropes that continue the status quo and divert attention from the needed changes. The youth in Children First's Justice in Education program are making clear demands by testifying before the Pennsylvania Basic Education Funding Commission and meeting with lawmakers. Their message is one of urgency and equity.

“Children First made sure that I knew that instead of funding public schools, state lawmakers were looking for ways to reduce public school funding and enrollment by increasing funds for private, and religious schools. My personal experience attending public, private and charter schools was enough for me to know that I had to act. We produced real results with more than half a billion dollars for public schools and no vouchers.”

Forcing Lawmakers to Focus on Needs of Young Children

More than 100,000 Pennsylvania children are locked out of pre-K programs proven to boost their educational outcomes, in part because parents can't afford the cost. Children First made sure Philadelphia politicians made solving this problem for children and parents their priority. Thanks to our deep relationships with dedicated local elected officials, early learning providers, and parents, Philadelphia's pre-K programs expanded to give 5,500 kids the smart start in life we know they need.

Organizing to Protect Kids from Environmental Hazards

Tens of thousands of children in PA are exposed to lead paint and lead dust in their homes putting them at grave risk of the lifetime consequences of lead poisoning. The Center for Disease Control is very clear that there is no safe level of lead exposure. Thanks to the leadership and creativity of Children First, the statewide Lead-Free Promise Project secured \$2 million – the state's first appropriation of its kind – to remediate the presence of lead in homes.

**Kids Campaign – Helping

Philadelphia elected its 100th Mayor in 2023. Children First's goal was to make kids the central focus of every candidate's campaign by recruiting more than 100 organizations and hundreds of parents and youth to join the Kids Campaign. Children First organized partners and helped them draft and release policy papers and hold candidate debates. Candidates knew what the Kids Campaign was demanding and that parents and kids were serious about making this election matter for them.

Now, more than 100 organizations are our partners focused on creating a robust youth mental health system, enact strategies to diversify the teacher corps, and stimulate a dramatic expansion of high schools offering students college courses, apprenticeships, and high-quality career and technical education.

Partnering with System Leaders to Meet the Mental Health Needs of Children

More than four in ten youth in Pennsylvania report feeling sad or depressed, which accounts for the spike in youth suicides, now the second leading cause of death for children (behind gun violence). Kicking off this new area of advocacy, in just one year, Children First has already moved public officials to increase spending for youth mental well-being at the state and local level. Children First is on the cusp of winning the systemic changes parents and youth tell us are most needed.

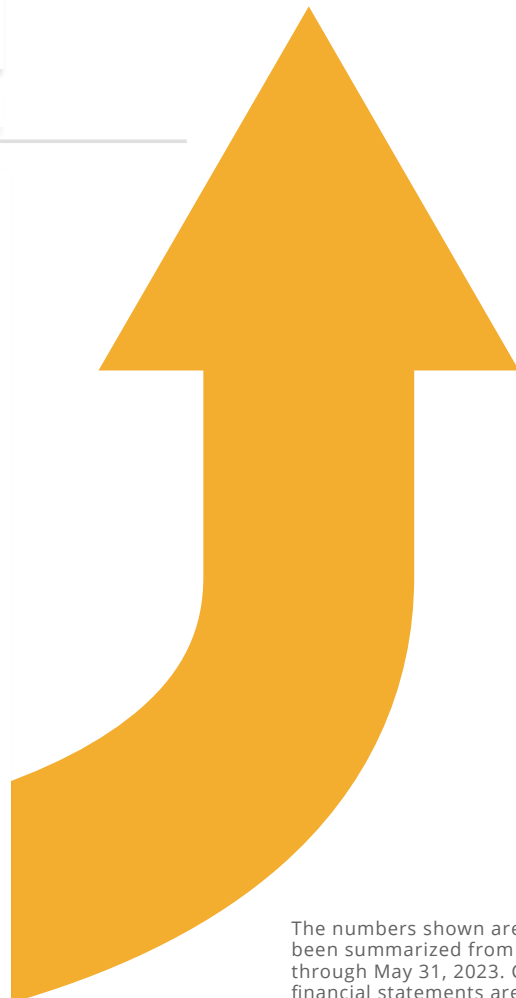
